POLICE STOP AND SEARCH RIGHTS UNDER THE TERRORISM ACT

Every person has a right to photograph in a public place and it is not against the law to photograph a police officer undertaking normal duties.

The police do have a duty to investigate incidents which may give rise to suspicion.

You are not required to give any personal details unless driving a car or you are arrested.

Officers may stop and search and view images if they believe they could be used in connection with terrorism.

Officers have no powers to delete images.

PCSOs may not search without a police officer present.

You must be provided with a copy of the Stop & Search slip which will include the officer's identity.

If stopped by a police officer remain calm and polite.

We all need to be vigilant against terrorism and support the police where possible as well as protect our rights to photograph in a public place.

We are grateful to the RPS who have agreed this wording with appropriate authorities. Neither the RPS, the PAGB or your Editor can be held accountable for any inaccuracy.

You may remember an article by our Treasurer, Peter Young, a few issues ago concerning a Club's liability for Corporation Tax. We are grateful for Ian Bailey's permission to publish this memorandum. This is purely for advice and you are recommended to seek guidance from your "local" tax office or a tax professional.

Camera Clubs/Photographic Societies and Corporation Tax

Having had several discussions with HMRC regarding corporation tax liability for Camera Clubs I have been unable to obtain a definitive ruling as to what activities will incur a corporation tax liability. HMRC will only give a ruling on a case by case basis and it is therefore the responsibility of each club to seek professional advice as to their individual circumstances. For guidance only, detailed below are some of the elements to consider.

- 1 Camera Clubs/Photographic Societies are treated as member's social clubs and are therefore subject to corporation tax on certain of their activities.
- 2 HMRC may treat some clubs with very small tax liabilities, (collectively known to HMRC as 'small clubs'), as dormant for Corporation Tax purposes. To qualify, both of the following must apply:
 - your club's annual Corporation Tax liability must not be expected to exceed £100
 - you run your club or organisation exclusively for the benefit of its members

If both apply, HMRC will not send a 'Notice to deliver a Company Tax Return' and will treat your club as dormant. They will review this at least every five years.

- 3 As a general rule fund raising activity within the club by the membership (e.g. raffles) is exempt from corporation tax. However fund raising from the general public and done on a regular basis would be considered to be trading and therefore taxable on the profit from such activity. Such fund raising activities could include inviting the general public to talks/lectures and participation of the general public to participate in photographic competitions/exhibitions.

- 4 Bank interest paid gross (i.e. without deduction of tax at source) is taxable, subject to the exemption in (2) above.

- 5 Fund raising (e.g raffles) at a normal club event attended by an invited club(s) or society('s) would be exempt from corporation tax, being deemed to be fund raising within the membership for the benefit of the club/society.

- 6 Whilst Charities generally are exempt from paying tax, seeking charitable status purely to avoid the payment of corporation tax or VAT is unacceptable to the Charities Commission. However clubs with significant incomes (currently £5k+) may also be liable for registration with the Charities Commission.

SUMMARY If a club wishes to raise funds from the general public it is best to seek professional advice as to any tax liability and charitable status with HMRC and The Charities Commission.
